WE WOULD LIKE TO RECOGNIZE THE FOLLOWING INDIVIDUALS...

- MICAELA MAIZ: In her fifth season at Lee, Micaela has recorded a dual record of 47-22 in singles competition and 44-21 in doubles. She earned ITA Scholar-Athlete honors following the 2022 season and was named to the GSC Academic Honor Roll the previous four years. Micaela also earned GSC Second Team honors in 2021 and GSC Freshman of the Week four times in 2019. In 2022, whe was rated as high as No. 44 in doubles (No. 10 in the South Region).
- MATINA UJDUR: Matina has posted a dual record of 19-24 in singles and 22-19 in doubles in her fourth season as a Lady Flame. She was named to the GSC Academic Honor Roll in 2020, 2021 and 2022; and was an ITA Scholar-Athlete in 2022. Matina also earned GSC Freshman of the Week in 2020.
- DREW JOHNSTON: In his fourth season at Lee, Drew has posted a 9-17 singles record and is 20-17 in doubles competition. He has earned mention on the GSC Academic Honor Roll in 2020, 2021 and 2022. He was also named an ITA Scholar-Athlete in 2020.
- DENIS MURATOVIC: Denis is 5-4 in singles matches and 1-4 in doubles during his Lee career. He earned GSC Academic Honor Roll in 2021 and 2022.
- NIGO RAMIREZ: Nico has posted a dual record of 36-18 in singles and 27-11 in doubles in his fourth season as a Flame. He earned GSC Second Team honors in 2021 and was selected GSC First Team in 2022. Nico is a three-time ITA Scholar-Athlete and was selected to the 2022 GSC Spring All-Academic Team. He also made the GSC Academic Honor Roll the past three seasons. Nico is currently ranked No. 21 in the ITA Collegiate Tennis Rankings sponsored by Tennis-Point.
- ◆ PEDRO SALVATORI: Pedro was a 2021 ITA Scholar-Athlete and also earned recognition on the 2021 GSC Academic Honor Roll. He has a 0-0 record in both singles and doubles competition in his Lee career.


MATINA UJDUR
